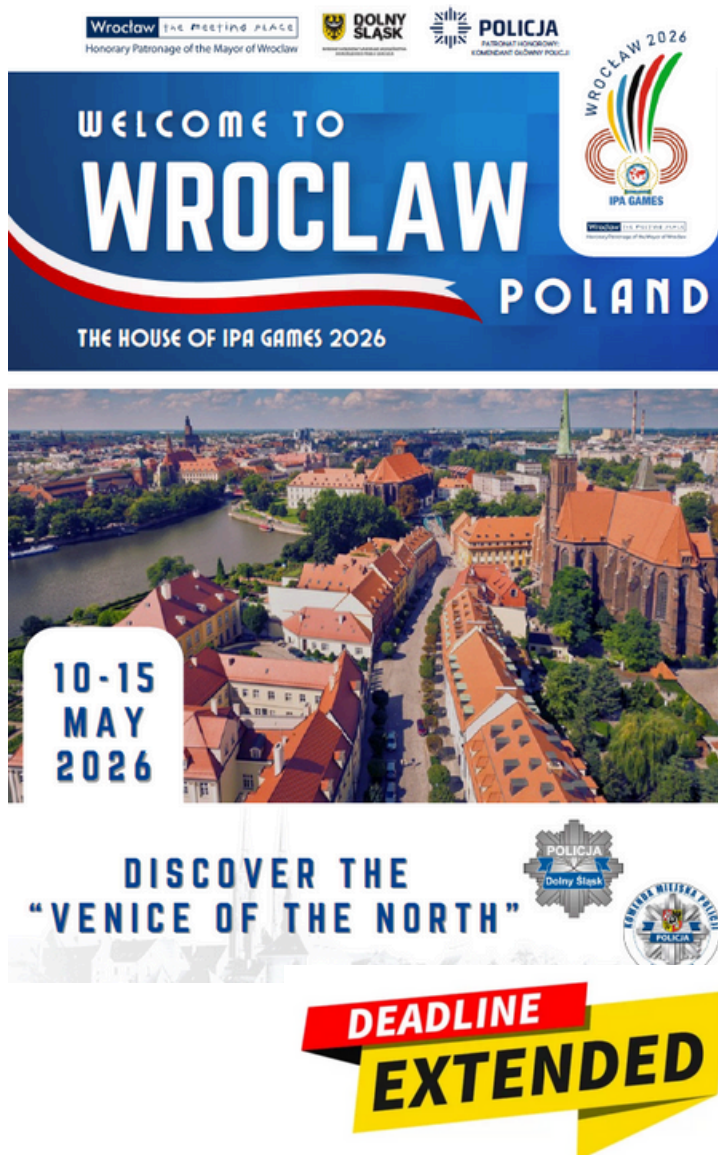
Sports Disciplines

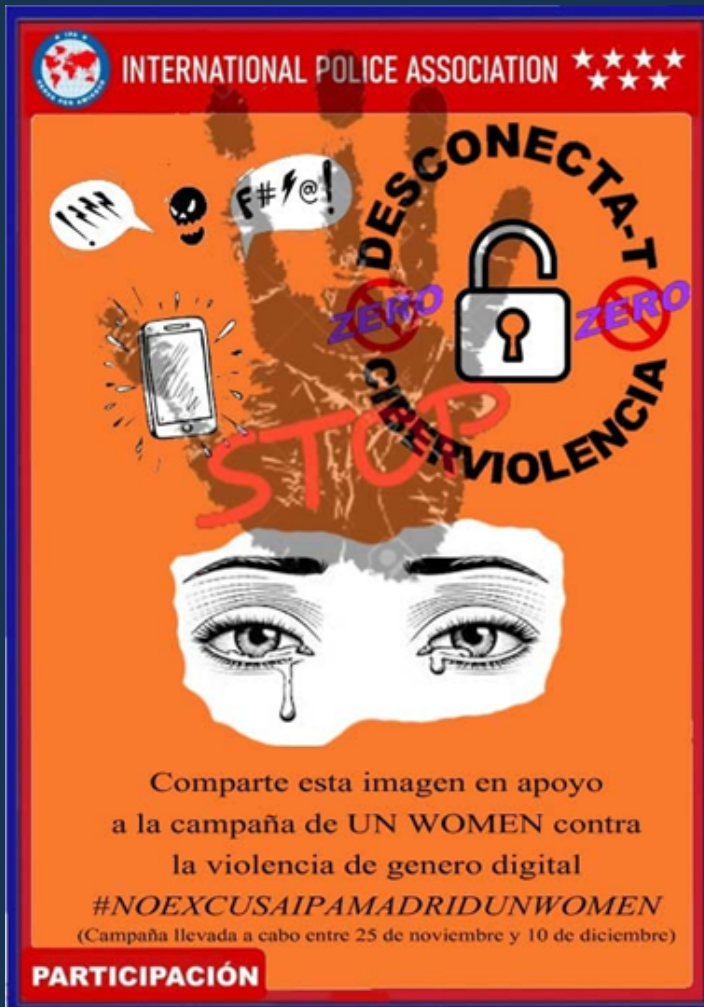
IPA Spain UNiTE to End Violence Against Girls and Women

On November 25th, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, IPA Spain was invited to participate in the campaign “UNITE DIGITAL VIOLENCE AGAINST GIRLS AND WOMEN” held by the United Nations — UN Women.

Acknowledging the importance of giving visibility to this project, IPA Madrid did not hesitate to support this initiative by creating, with the participation of the entire team, a public board on the UN Women website with various activities.

The first task carried out by José Barroso, was the creation of a poster emphasizing the suffering of harassment online victims. Expressive, tear-filled eyes of a woman alongside the words “Disconnect-t” is the best way to sketch this idea.

Afterward, two more posters were created with the help of AI, aimed at learning the most common expressions associated with cybercrimes. Our intention was to spark curiosity about the behaviours involved in each of the crimes described.



Sixteen days of activism that started the same day, highlighting the importance of raising community awareness about this serious social problem. As a significant figure, it is worth mentioning that the number of reports in the second quarter of 2025 have increased by 2.69% compared to the previous year.



As the second part of the project, a citizens participation roundtable was set up in one of the hallways of IFISE (Institute for Comprehensive Training in Security and Emergencies of the Community of Madrid).

IPA Spain UNiTE to End Violence Against Girls and Women

On this roundtable, small orange ribbons were placed for participants to wear on their lapels, as well as blank cards that both students and professionals from the Law enforcement agencies could freely fill out, answering the question: What measures can be taken to combat cyber violence against girls and women?



In this case, the responses resulted in short phrases or slogans such as: "Use the internet to raise awareness, not to generate violence," "Treat women as if they were your own family," and "Education and shared family responsibility."

Among the law enforcement agencies, officers from different parts of Galicia, who were visiting the IFISE facilities at the time, showed interest in the participation table.

As the days went by, more slogans were added to the UN Women website, eventually reaching a total of 15. Likewise, our colleague Noelia uploaded an article referring to the role of the Madrid Municipal Police—particularly the work of School Tutor officers—in preventing digital gender violence against minors and young people from an educational, emotional and family perspective.

Last but not least, I can't thank enough everyone at IPA Madrid who helped me in my first experience with this international project. I would also express my gratitude for the special collaboration of Antonio Montejano, who created a song accompanied by images of women painted by himself.

Outside the Organisation group, I would like to thank altruistic collaborators such as Loli, Sara and Manu, who generously volunteered to create an awareness video about online dangers.

May our contribution serve to loudly declare that WE ARE AGAINST ALL FORMS OF VIOLENCE, ESPECIALLY THAT IS DIRECTED TOWARD THE MOST VULNERABLE PEOPLE. WE HOPE AN INTERCONNECTED WORLD, FREE OF CYBER THREATS. A MORE ORANGE ONE. This is the colour chosen by the United Nations to represent a brighter future free from violence, as well as a symbol of hope, energy and action to eradicate it.

Friendship Judo Week 2025

IPA Japan Section

From November 24 to 30, 2025, the Friendship Judo Week (FJW) was held at the Chiba Prefectural Police (CPP) Headquarters and YohaS Arena, a municipal sports facility in Chiba City, located about 40 kilometers east of Tokyo. The event was organized by IPA Japan Section with the full cooperation of the CPP. Seven participants from five countries—six men and one woman—with a wide range of judo levels, from a complete beginner to a third-degree black belt, had an invaluable opportunity to learn the spirit and techniques of authentic Japanese judo.



The four days of intensive judo practice began with an opening ceremony at the CPP Headquarters' dojo (martial arts training hall) on the morning of November 25. At the ceremony, Ms. Ayako Aoyama, Chief of the CPP, and Mr. Masahito Kanetaka, President of IPA Japan, welcomed the participants and offered words of encouragement, greatly stimulating their desire to learn judo.

Judo practice was mainly held at YohaS Arena and began with instruction on "Rei" (courtesy or etiquette) from Mr. Kazuya Iwashita, Deputy Chief Judo Instructor for the CPP. The participants listened attentively as he explained the importance of showing respect to opponents while practicing judo.

Subsequently, instructions were given throughout the sessions on posture, grappling, ukemi (falling techniques), throwing, and ground work. Time passed swiftly as the six judo instructors from the CPP taught with enthusiasm, careful attention to detail, and occasional humor. On November 27, the dojo's atmosphere was further heightened by the visit of Barcelona Olympic gold medalist Mr. Hidehiko Yoshida and the 1985 Italy International Judo Tournament gold medalist Mr. Kazumi Shin. The participants eagerly received advice from the two champions, with excited expressions on their faces.

In addition to judo practice, on November 26 the participants attended an Aikido session led by Mr. Fumiaki Matsuda, a member of IPA Japan, showcasing elegant and precise techniques. Thanks to arrangements made by the CPP, the participants also enjoyed a welcome concert by the police band and visited the CPP Headquarters and Chiba Chuo (Central) Police Station.



Friendship Judo Week 2025 IPA Japan Section

On November 28, the judo practice sessions concluded with a graduation ceremony at the CPP Headquarters' dojo. During the ceremony, the participants demonstrated the skills they had acquired. As each participant performed dynamic throwing techniques in randori (free practice), a resounding round of applause echoed throughout the dojo. Certificates of completion were then presented to each participant by President of IPA Japan with a firm handshake.



A farewell party was held at a restaurant near YohaS Arena in the evening following the graduation ceremony. Numerous members of IPA Japan, senior CPP officers, and the judo instructors attended. Over food and drinks, the attendees praised the participants for their dedication over the four days, and all deepened their friendship beyond national boundaries, creating truly memorable moments.

On November 29, the participants went on a one-day excursion to Hakone, a renowned tourist destination, guided by members of IPA Japan Kanagawa Branch. On November 30, the FJW concluded as the participants departed the hotel where they had stayed, warmly seen off by members of IPA Japan Chiba Branch.

In conclusion, there is no doubt that the FJW was profoundly meaningful for the overseas participants, as they had the opportunity to receive direct instruction from Japanese judo experts. For IPA Japan, this marked the first occasion of holding an international event in full collaboration with a police organization, providing valuable experience that will help broaden the scope of IPA Japan's future activities. From this perspective, the FJW can be considered a great success.

IPA Romania International Conference on the Danube – A Global Common Good

From 1–4 October 2025, Drobeta Turnu Severin, Romania, hosted the IPA International Conference entitled “Holistic Protection of the Danube – A Global Common Good, A Holistic Approach to Legislative Challenges in the European Danube Basin”, organized by IPA Romanian Section, in cooperation with IPA Region 1 Mehedinți.

The conference brought together police officers from Romania and abroad, along with environmental and cultural heritage specialists, aiming to raise awareness of the importance of protecting the Danube’s natural ecosystems, biodiversity, and cultural heritage.

The Danube River, Europe’s second-longest river, crosses 10 countries and influences 19 nations through its basin, making it the most international river in the world. Special attention was given to the Danube Delta, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, highlighting the need for coordinated international action.



Delegations from Greece, Poland, Slovakia, Serbia, Moldova and North Macedonia participated in the event, strengthening international cooperation and the exchange of best practices within the IPA family.

Key topics included environmental crime prevention, protection of cultural heritage, modern training concepts for police officers, and enhanced cross-border cooperation to address environmental and heritage-related offences.

The conference reaffirmed IPA’s commitment to international partnership, professional development, and the shared responsibility of safeguarding the Danube as a vital European and global resource.

Empowering Female Leaders in Law Enforcement IPA Seminar Report – IBZ Gimborn, 23–27 October 2025 Attendee: Ms Busisiwe Pharmphyilia Rantise (South Africa)

The IPA seminar “Empowering Female Leaders in Law Enforcement” was held at IBZ Gimborn from 23–27 October 2025 and brought together **women from different countries to learn, share, and empower one another.**

Day 1 – Arrival & Induction

Upon arrival, I was warmly welcomed into a room filled with beautiful women, love, laughter, and kindness. I immediately felt at home and comfortable due to the genuine warmth shown by everyone.



Day 2 – Outdoor Programme

We visited the Police Training Camp in Brühl, where the Dog Unit Commander delivered an informative presentation on unit structure, functionality, success stories, and best practices. The dog search demonstrations for drugs, stolen items, and suspects were impressive and showcased excellent training and discipline. Crowd management and peace management demonstrations further highlighted the important role of police in community safety.

Later, we visited Cologne for brunch and sightseeing. Despite the cold and rain, the experience was memorable. The Cologne Cathedral and the vibrant FRÜH Brewery reflected how people come together to enjoy shared moments.



Day 3 – Empowerment Sessions

The session “How the IPA Works” by Marian Raducu deepened my understanding of IPA’s history and structure and highlighted the need for transformation and increased women representation in leadership.

“Understanding the Mindset of Gen Z” by Ruth Freth was an eye-opener, reminding us that it is okay to have different opinions and that understanding Gen Z requires openness and awareness.

“Empowered Women Empower Women” by Dr Dinah Marathe was deeply inspiring. Seeing a black female leader in such a senior position gave hope for transformation. Key lessons included knowing one’s purpose, emotional intelligence, guidance through leadership, and remembering that women are enough, unique, and powerful.

Presentations by Meike Ahlers on authentic leadership and Kimberly Geber on leadership and mental health emphasized self-awareness, integrity, accountability, resilience, and the importance of addressing mental health openly.

Day 4 – Inclusive Leadership & Crisis Leadership

Dr Jose Rooijers delivered a powerful session on inclusive leadership, focusing on humility, the five pillars of inclusion, and the legacy we leave behind.

Dr Yogananda Pittman shared an inspiring crisis leadership journey following the events of 6 January 2021 in the USA. Her story highlighted organizational growth after trauma, courageous leadership, and empowering women based on capability and commitment.



Conclusion

As an Arthur Troop Scholarship Award winner, I shared my journey and passion for women empowerment and transformation. This seminar opened doors for me, inspired confidence, and strengthened my commitment to empowering others. I left Gimborn changed, empowered, and deeply grateful to IPA and the ATS opportunity.
