

IEB Mid Term Meeting in Lapland – New Impulses for the IPA



From 4 to 7 December, the International Executive Board met at the IPA House in Äkäslompolo, Lapland, for its Mid Term Meeting. The gathering provided an opportunity to review the achievements of the first two years of the term and to set clear priorities for 2026 and 2027.

A major focus was the further development of the IPA Strategy 2023–2027. The Board identified several areas requiring refinement and began outlining a forward-looking framework to strengthen digitalisation, professional training, organisational development and international cooperation. As part of this work, a medium-term international planning process was carried out to define where the IPA should stand by 2031. The updated version of the Strategy will be published at the beginning of 2026.

As part of the strategy review, all IEB members, together with the IAC and the Legal Advisor, participated in a structured reflection session. This open exchange clarified the key priorities for the second half of the term and supported the planning of major projects for 2026 and 2027, including international seminars, commission initiatives and the continued development of international documents.

The Board also agreed to relaunch the project for a global IPA App, with the objective of delivering it by 2027. Earlier groundwork will be reassessed to ensure a practical and financially viable implementation. A solution for a digital membership card is being evaluated separately and, subject to affordability, could be introduced as early as 2026.

Enhanced financial reporting measures were also agreed as part of the strategic priorities for 2026 and 2027. These include a clearer and more transparent presentation of the IEB budget from 2026 onwards, enabling Sections to better understand expenditure areas and financial planning.

IEB Mid Term Meeting in Lapland – New Impulses for the IPA

Preparations for the Statutes Convention in Lisbon in March 2026 formed another substantial part of the meeting. The Board discussed potential amendments to the International Statutes and Rules, reviewed the Job Descriptions of IEB members and examined how cooperation with hosting Sections of future World Congresses can be improved.

In addition, the Board addressed urgent operational matters. Following the severe flooding in Sri Lanka, the IEB authorised immediate Emergency Aid and issued the corresponding international communication.

At the close of the meeting, the IEB expressed its sincere thanks to the Finnish Section. In particular, Eija and Topso who provided excellent on-site support and ensured that the Board could work in a highly professional and welcoming environment.

The outcomes of this Half Term Meeting set a clear and confident direction for the years ahead. I wish to thank all Sections for their excellent cooperation and ongoing support. Your commitment and dedication strengthen our international community and enable us to move forward with purpose. Together, we will continue developing the IPA and shaping its future with professionalism, unity and shared spirit.

UN Women and Policing: Gender Equality in Policing and Peacekeeping

UN Women is advancing gender equality in global security by integrating gender-responsive policing into peacekeeping missions and police services. With its first Police Adviser now in place, the organisation is strengthening efforts to protect women and promote inclusive law enforcement worldwide.



UN Women, the United Nations entity for gender equality and women's empowerment, was established in 2010 and operates in more than 80 countries. Its mission is to advance women's rights globally, focusing on leadership, economic empowerment, ending violence against women, and the Women, Peace and Security (WPS) agenda.

Policing plays a vital role in peacekeeping and post-conflict recovery. Gender-responsive policing ensures protection for women and girls, addresses all forms of gender-based violence, including technology-facilitated GBV (TFGBV), and builds trust with communities. UN Women works with peacekeeping missions and national police services to integrate gender perspectives into law enforcement through training, policy guidance, and advocacy.

In February 2025, UN Women appointed its first-ever Police Adviser, Assistant Chief Constable Ines Zeitner, supported by Germany. This role strengthens UN Women's engagement with policing institutions worldwide, promoting inclusive security and accountability. The Police Adviser focuses on embedding gender-responsive policing in peace operations, supporting reforms that protect women and girls in fragile contexts and foster collaboration with UN entities such as UNODC and UNICRI, as well as Police Advisers from Member States.

Through these efforts, UN Women ensures that gender equality in policing moves beyond principle to practice—building safer, more inclusive societies and advancing sustainable peace.

IPA Japan's First International Seminar

"JAPAN SEMINAR 2025" Held in Yokohama 11–14 October 2025 | Kanagawa Prefectural Police Headquarters

The JAPAN SEMINAR 2025, announced at the IEB and Asia-Pacific Regional Meeting this past May, concluded with resounding success. Welcoming its first overseas participants, the event opened with splendid fireworks over Yokohama Harbour and closed with breathtaking night views from the Ferris wheel. We sincerely wish all participants every success in their future endeavours, enriched by this invaluable experience.



Pre-meeting communication via chat app

As October began, participants from overseas started arriving in Japan in succession. Three days prior to the seminar, all participants—both international and Japanese members—along with the Japan-based instructors, joined a group chat to begin interacting, including self-introductions. This fostered interest in each person's character and heightened anticipation to meet and converse in person. Consequently, when meeting for the first time, greetings felt like those between old acquaintances, allowing friendships to form rapidly.

On the eve of the seminar, 11 October, while the secretariat staff were preparing at the venue, the Kanagawa Prefectural Police Headquarters, the cohesion of the overseas members and the thoughtfulness of Mr. Osawa from the Kanagawa Region led to an impromptu visit to the headquarters. This was to confirm the route from the hotel to the police headquarters and to inspect the venue. Then, the moment the group arrived at the venue, fireworks erupted outside the window—a miraculous timing that moved everyone. We switched off the lights to enjoy the fleeting display. These fireworks, seemingly welcoming overseas members who had travelled all the way to Japan for learning, appeared to further strengthen the bonds among members sharing the same view.

Thanks to these preliminary exchanges and venue inspections, a friendly atmosphere had been cultivated. With the addition of Japanese participants, the venue instantly became an even more vibrant space. However, true to the nature of a gathering of police officers, the opening ceremony commenced punctually and proceeded smoothly into the lectures.

This punctuality among all participants was strictly observed throughout the entire seminar programme, greatly assisting the secretariat in ensuring the smooth running of the event. Moreover, beyond their punctuality, the courtesy displayed by the overseas participants was truly impressive.

Curriculum and Lecturer

The "Koban system" was an indispensable theme as a characteristic of Japan's police system. This year's seminar featured an additional lecture on "International Cooperation in Japanese Policing" by Ms. Kazumi Ogasawara, currently Director General for International Affairs at the National Police Agency (recently elected as the first Asian woman to serve on the INTERPOL Executive Committee). As in the previous year, a lecture was also given by the inaugural Director of the Cyber Bureau.

Additionally, an online lecture from Thailand was a first-time initiative. Furthermore, Mr. Robin Mann from Germany presented on "Crime Trends and Mobile Police Activities in Germany" as a participant representative. Lectures were also given on case studies of international cooperation activities by IPA Japan members and on Japan's traffic safety measures.

All content was highly engaging, and participants listened attentively throughout the lengthy lectures. While fully understanding the English presentations might have been challenging for Japanese-speaking attendees, visual aids via slides and subsequent information exchanges likely compensated for this.

Concludes

To provide cultural experiences and entertainment within the limited timeframe, we also offered opportunities such as tea breaks between lectures, a Ferris wheel ride, shopping on the final morning, and nature experiences. Over ten years ago, we lost contact and failed to meet overseas members at the rendezvous point, but this seminar made us deeply grateful for advances in digital technology. Communication tools and translation software are now readily available.

The contribution of Mr. Alex Zaganus from IPA Canada's British Columbia Branch, who is particularly proficient in Japanese, was truly outstanding. He led the international members with the dedication of a principal and the diligence of an administrator, scrambling to prepare the venue and frequently providing interpretation during lectures. The cooperative attitude of the other participants embodied the spirit of service inherent in police officers, truly reflecting the IPA motto: "Service through Friendship."

The IPA Japan Section's first international seminar can be considered a great success, thanks to the outstanding lecturers and enthusiastic participants. I sincerely hope this experience proves beneficial in some way to the careers of all the police officers who participated.

The Japan Seminar 2025 in Yokohama

For me, it was clear that if I were to travel to Asia, it would be to Japan. To see Tokyo, the largest city in the world. To experience the coexistence of modernity and culture. And? Of course, to get to know the police in Japan. IPA makes it possible! Luckily, I happened to plan my trip for October 2025, so I also applied for the upcoming Japan Seminar from October 11th to October 14th. Before I knew it, I became one of six lucky participants who had the opportunity to attend various presentations on crime in Asia, the successful "Koban System," and many other fascinating topics.



In a WhatsApp group created beforehand, I was already able to get to know the participants of the seminar. It turned out that, in addition to several attendees from different prefectures of Japan, colleagues from Canada, Pakistan, Kenya, Iceland, and another colleague from Germany had registered for the seminar. After a few eventful days with the IPA in Tokyo and Osaka, the first day of the seminar finally arrived. This day was meant for arriving, checking in, and getting to know each other. Punctually at 9:30 a.m. the next morning, the program began. After a short tour through the Kanagawa Police Headquarters, the President of IPA Japan, Mr. Masahito Kanetaka, welcomed us to the seminar. On the first day, we were able to attend several very interesting presentations covering topics such as the existing Koban System, road traffic safety, and cooperation between Japan and Indonesia.



As the Koban System particularly interested me, here is a brief explanation: The "Kobans" are essentially mini police stations distributed densely throughout the country. In these "police boxes," you can report crimes, register lost items, or simply ask the police for advice. The primary goal of the Kobans is to make the police visible and approachable for citizens. A typical shift consists of three officers and one retired colleague. Shifts are 24 hours long, followed by two days off for recovery. A Koban officer's daily duties include not only foot patrols but also house visits to establish direct contact with the community.

This "community policing" system has already been adopted in 12 countries, including Singapore and Indonesia. Statistics there showed that crime rates decreased after the introduction of Kobans.

Hardly had we learned everything theoretically about the Koban System when we made our way to visit one. On-site, the officers on duty showed us not only their essential equipment but also the facilities of the small building. After we had the chance to bombard them with questions, the day's presentations came to an end.

And so the second day of presentations began. Just like in Europe, Asia is also facing massive issues with online fraud, so-called "scams." We were given insights into the most common types of fraud, as well as the methods used to track down such organized groups. We continued with the international work of the Japanese police.

After enjoying another bowl of udon for lunch, a retired colleague from the Royal Thai Police joined via video call for the next presentation. He gave us insights into crime and police work in Thailand as well. The day was rounded off by the German colleague Mr. Robin Mang, who gave a very interesting presentation about his work.

As soon as the presentations ended, the ceremonial handing out of the certificates and the exchange of small gifts among colleagues took place. The final dinner at the World Beer Museum in Kanagawa was a must.

The next morning, it was time to say goodbye. After a brief morning shopping tour and a stroll through the Yokohama Sankeien Garden, the seminar finally came to an end. I would like to sincerely thank IPA Japan, especially Ms. Kazuko Sato, who organized everything and guided us through the seminar. I believe I can speak on behalf of all international participants when I say that the seminar was a complete success. As for me, I say goodbye! Sayonara!

Blue Light Ride Brings Light Into The Darkness – IPA Netherlands

On Wednesday 10 December 2025, it was time again for the fourth edition of the International Police Association Blue Light Ride. This event is organised under the banner of IPA Limburg-Noord (The Netherlands) and is dedicated to surprising sick children and residents of care institutions. During the Blue Light Ride, emergency responders from various emergency services work together to hopefully help sick children forget their illness for a while. Bringing all these first responders together and increasing cohesion between all these services is therefore the second objective of the Blue Light Ride.



That afternoon, a convoy of around 120 emergency vehicles drove from Toverland amusement park in Sevenum to VieCuri Medical Centre in Venlo. Along the way, thousands of people lined the route to wave to the emergency workers, and residents of various care institutions were greeted.

Upon arrival at VieCuri, five-year-old Loa was allowed to count down, setting off a deafening spectacle of sirens and flashing lights. Boats on the River Meuse and a circling police helicopter completed the picture. This gave many emergency responders goosebumps and brought tears to their eyes.

The emergency workers then handed out gifts in the children's and maternity wards. The faces of the children made a lasting impression. What followed were heart-warming encounters between sick children, their brothers and sisters, and the first responders.

In the meantime, members of IPA Limburg-Noord handed out soup to the emergency crews present in the car park. To prepare this, some members (and their partners) had spent the whole day in the kitchen. This year, national secretary Kees Jongh and national treasurer Pieter van der Wal were also present.

This year, IPA Limburg-Noord organised a three-day exchange program around the Blue Light Ride for the first time. 'Strength and Influence of Women in the Security Sector'

Belgrade – Thursday 27th November 2025

On Thursday 27th November, I had the pleasure and honour of representing both the International Police Association - Section UK and the Professional Commission #SHEisIPA project at the 4th Conference of the Network of Women in the Police of the Republic of Serbia. This was a joint event with the European Network of Policewomen (ENP), supported and sponsored by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and with reps from DCAF – Geneva Centre (Security Sector Governance) for Security Sector Governance present. The conference theme: 'Strength and Influence of Women in the Security Sector'.



Held in the Palace of Serbia – Belgrade Hall, the event was opened by Serbian Prime Minister Prof Dr. Duro Macut and many of the Serbian cabinet were present. Their attendance underlined a commitment to the issues being discussed and will provide Katerina Tomasevic – President of the Network of Women in the Police of the Republic of Serbia and the European Network of Women in the Police a chance to hold them to account long after the event closed.

Many of those delegates present were IPA members (inc. President Section Serbia and President Section Montenegro). Twenty-five European countries were represented along with associated agencies supporting security projects the region. Each country's lead delegate provided a short presentation around the conference theme based on the National experience. This made for a very unique insight into the lived experiences of women in policing from around Europe.

I was invited to represent the International Police Association (IPA) and notably the SHEisIPA project. This event offered a chance for me to lean into, and spotlight in my presentation the work being undertaken by the International Executive Board's (IEB's) International Relations Commission in relation to the UN Social Economic Council's Commission on the Status of Women, which takes place in March 26. This includes SHEisIPA, UNiTE and HeForShe. Section UK has been involved in some of this work, notably in the area of online abuse where Detective Inspector Emma Portfleet leads of this for Essex Police. This is a really exciting time for the IPA and the above-mentioned projects in terms of visibility and contribution in this arena.

This very much ties in with the separate request for funding to hold a second SHEisIPA event next year in conjunction with the UNiTE Project and the Education Project. That would present wonderful opportunity to invite some of those connected with this event, particularly those NGO's associated with security and policing in the region, to raise visibility for the IPA and work being done in this particular space.

Additionally, this was a superb opportunity for me to discuss with European colleagues the opportunities of exchanges and associated activities that feature the Section UK plan for 2026. The DECAF-funded Association of Women in Police are an example of a team keen to work with Section UK in pursuit of this. It also speaks to the work that will be undertaken in the new year to develop engagement within the network of younger members in Section UK.

All in all, this event was a superb opportunity for me across a number of levels, and I felt hugely privileged to have been invited.

IPA Greece – UNiTE to End Digital Violence Against All Women and Girls

As part of the 16 Days of Activism, within the framework of the UN Campaign to End Violence against Women, several regions in Greece participated in various events to raise awareness.

IPA Region Larisa, Greece is pleased to share highlights from its involvement in the IPA Orange the World initiative, held during IPA Friendship Week in Larisa. Demonstrating strong support for the global effort to end violence against women, the Region incorporated the colour orange throughout the campaign—from accreditation cards to event bracelets—symbolising hope and a brighter future free from violence.

During the same event, a formal Twinning Ceremony took place between IPA Region Larisa (Greece), IPA Region Nicosia (Cyprus), and IPA Region Sofia City (Bulgaria). In a powerful display of unity, women from the three Regions raised a placard carrying a shared message: There is no excuse for violence against women.



IPA Region Lasithi Hosts Educational Workshops for School Community Empowerment

As part of its ongoing initiatives, to strengthen the school community, in the frame of Orange the World initiative, IPA Region Lasithi organized two educational workshops on Friday, December 12, 2025, at the Elounda Primary School in Lasithi. The sessions were led by Mr. Konstantinos Fragkakis, President of IPA Region Lasithi, with the goal of raising awareness and fostering a culture of safety, respect, and responsibility among students.

The workshops focused on the following themes: Modern Online Risks

Domestic Violence: Awareness and Protection

During the sessions, students received age-appropriate guidance on issues related to safe internet use, recognizing dangerous behaviours, and the importance of prevention, timely reporting, and seeking help in cases of violence or abusive behaviour. Special emphasis was placed on enhancing self-protection, empathy, and trust in adults and supportive institutions.

Through these initiatives, the IPA Region Lasithi reaffirms its commitment to educating and empowering young people, equipping them with the knowledge and skills needed to navigate challenges safely and responsibly.

International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women: Coordinated Awareness Campaigns in Lasithi

In observance of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, coordinated actions took place in the central squares of Agios Nikolaos, Ierapetra, and Sitia. The Greek Police, the International Police Association – IPA Region Lasithi, and the Lasithi Police Officers' Union, in collaboration with the respective municipalities, delivered a strong message of awareness and solidarity.

Arthur Troop Scholarship Next Gen Policing Terrorism: Response and Investigation

AT IBZ SCHLOSS GIMBORN FROM 14.09.2025 TO 19.09.2025**

The International Police Association (IPA), a platform of networking and friendship, creates various opportunities for its members to foster exchange of professional knowledge and skills through seminars and conferences convened in different countries. It awards the Arthur Troop Scholarship (ATS) every year to IPA members for capacity building in the law enforcement field. In this connection, IPA has established IBZ Schloss Gimborn (Germany), which conducts professional seminars for law enforcement officers including IPA members.

In pursuit of my keen desire to improve my professional knowledge and skills, I applied for the Arthur Troop Scholarship and was fortunate to be selected for 2025. Out of 41 offered seminars, I chose the seminar titled "NextGen Policing – Terrorism: Response and Investigation" to gain insight into current international practices to combat terrorism. I participated in the seminar from 14th to 19th September 2025.



On Day 1, Ms. Ulrike Hoffman welcomed 14 participants from different countries and gave an overview of the seminar. Mr. Philipp Kurz, President of IPA Germany, gave a presentation on the IPA structure and functions of its commissions, enriching participants' understanding of IPA and its global role.



Day 2 focused on understanding terrorism. Mr. Martijn Bijlsma delivered lectures on the psychology and planning cycle of terrorism, types of terrorism, radicalisation phases, and the use of the internet and dark web. Mr. Bryan explained the terrorists' planning cycle and introduced OSINT. Group activities and discussions actively engaged participants and enhanced learning.

Arthur Troop Scholarship Next Gen Policing Terrorism: Response and Investigation

Day 3 introduced the interactive "Gimborn Murderer" scenario exercise led by a team of seven trainers. Participants were divided into teams and worked on interconnected scenarios using digital tools and practical exercises, including arrest simulations and physical training. These activities stimulated both mental and physical engagement and fostered teamwork.

On Day 4, participants undertook surveillance and counter-surveillance exercises during a field trip to Cologne. Teams conducted on-foot surveillance in public spaces, applying professional techniques in real-life conditions, followed by group reflection and discussion.

Day 5 focused on VIP protection and extraction scenarios. Teams alternated between attacker and law enforcement roles, followed by structured debriefings highlighting strengths and areas for improvement. Course evaluation and assessments were completed, and participants were awarded certificates.

On the final day, trainers and trainees reviewed the seminar and bid farewell, having formed strong professional and personal bonds.



Key Takeaways

The quality of training and the commitment of the trainers were exceptional. The blend of theory and practice made the seminar highly effective and engaging. The management of IBZ Schloss Gimborn ensured a conducive learning environment, comfortable accommodation, and excellent hospitality. The seminar also provided a valuable opportunity to build friendships, exchange souvenirs, and strengthen international cooperation among law enforcement professionals.

I express my sincere gratitude to the International Police Association for awarding me the Arthur Troop Scholarship 2025, and to Ms. Ulrike Hoffman for her assistance. The seminar was both professionally enriching and personally memorable.

After a brief presentation of the organisational facts, we moved on to the practical demonstrations of working with police dogs. This was an exciting insight for all participants and there was a lively exchange with the German colleagues about similarities and differences between the respective police forces.



Afterwards followed a presentation from the riot police. In addition to a theoretical presentation of the areas of operation, there was a practical demonstration of assembly situations. It was nice to see that there were female managers in both the service dog handler squad and the riot police teams, and this opportunity was seized upon to expand the SHEisIPA network. Afterwards, the cultural part of the trip took us to Cologne before returning to Gimborn for a typical local meal.

Saturday began with the IPA Fundamentals, which were impressively presented by Magda Raducu (Section Romania). Many interesting questions showed that not all the benefits of IPA membership are yet known, and it is therefore all the more gratifying that the content will remain available on policing.tv after the event.

Empowering Female Leaders in Law Enforcement Seminar

With her presentation on Understanding the Mindset of Gen Z, Ruth Frett (Devon and Cornwall Police) laid the foundation for a better understanding of Generation Z. This provided important insights for recruiting new members, as well as approaches to the interests of the next generation.

The presentation by Commissioner Dinah Marathe (Botswana Police Service), the first woman in Botswana to hold the position of police commissioner, was very well received. She gave an impressive account of her career path and motivated those present to support each other and take responsibility. Pel Marumo then reported on her IPA work on SHEisIPA in the African chapter.

The afternoon was devoted to authentic leadership by Meike Ahlers. Many values, such as openness and communication, also play an important role in the IPA and are crucial for a well-functioning organisation. The important points were explored in more depth in working groups. Mental health is becoming an increasingly important aspect for police, managers and executives in the IPA.

Kimberly Geber gave a keynote speech supported by practical examples and theories on how to improve mental health in leadership and the workplace, with input on how to reduce stress. After a busy day of seminars, the cultural exchange continued with the traditional culture night, where participants bring food and drinks typical of their country to share.

Two presentations were scheduled for the last day of the seminar. Jose Rooijers took the participants on a journey into inclusive leadership under the motto "inclusivity is not about fitting in – it's all about being valued for standing out", demonstrating how differences can help you get ahead. Yogananda Pittman presented on Leading in a Crisis, sharing her experience as a senior executive during the attack on Capitol Hill, USA on 6 January 2021, and what she learned from the experience.

There was positive feedback about the seminar all round, although it was noted that more days were needed. Participants were able to take away something for themselves personally from all the presentations and apply what they learned in their roles at the IPA.

A Path of Integration, Institutional Recognition, and International Projection

The International Police Association (IPA) is the largest police organisation in the world, with a presence in more than 80 countries. Its mission is based on strengthening friendship, cooperation, and professional exchange among members of police forces, under the motto *Servo per Amikeco* (Service through Friendship).

In Colombia, these principles have been materialised through a progressive, serious, and committed process, which today positions the IPA Colombia Section as a growing organisation with institutional recognition and international projection.

The development of the IPA in Colombia has been the result of the constant work of officers deeply committed to the values of the Association and to the need to integrate the country into international police cooperation scenarios. A decisive milestone in this process was the formal opening for the voluntary affiliation of uniformed personnel in active service, an achievement that marked a turning point in the history of the Section by significantly strengthening its legitimacy, representativeness, and institutional support.

This process received its first regulatory support through Instruction No. 007 DIPON-OFPLA dated September 20, 2024, signed by General William Salamanca, Director General of the Colombian National Police. This instruction established the guidelines for the voluntary affiliation of active-duty personnel to the International Police Association – IPA Colombia Section, ensuring that such participation was conducted in accordance with existing institutional regulations and the principles governing the IPA worldwide.

Subsequently, this progress was formally consolidated through Transitional Directive DAT 045 DIPON-OFPLA dated November 18, 2025, signed by Brigadier General William Oswaldo Rincón Zambrano, Director General of the Colombian National Police. This directive constituted a fundamental milestone by establishing the institutional framework that enabled the active and legitimate participation of uniformed personnel in active service within the IPA, reaffirming the official support of the institution for this process of international integration.

A Path of Integration, Institutional Recognition, and International Projection

As a result of these historic advances, another unprecedented achievement was reached in the present year: the participation of Colonel Hernando Vallejo, who became the first active-duty officer of the Colombian National Police to attend an International IPA Congress, officially representing the institution. This participation took place alongside the President of the IPA Colombia Section, Colonel (Ret.) José Antonio González Fariñas, consolidating Colombia's presence on the international stage of the Association and generating a positive impact reflected in an increase of more than 300% in the number of uniformed personnel affiliated with the IPA Colombia Section.

This achievement symbolises not only the institutional recognition attained, but also the sustained effort that has enabled the IPA Colombia Section to move forward firmly in its process of structuring and strengthening. Currently, the Section is in a stage of provisional status, understood as a phase of solid development, internal organisation, and alignment with the international standards of the IPA, with a view toward greater consolidation and future projection.

The path travelled to date reflects the commitment, discipline, and strategic vision of those who have led this project. The International Police Association – Colombia Section continues to move forward with determination, reaffirming its commitment to international cooperation, professional exchange, and the strengthening of bonds of friendship among police forces worldwide.
